HNW members attending 'live' events where legally acceptable, please adhere to the following HNW protocols based on government guidance and law.

HNW PROTOCOLS FOR ATTENDING LIVE EVENTS IN COVID-SECURE SETTINGS

- 1. Please do not attend a live session if you are feeling unwell, have a temperature, a persistent cough or have recently lost your sense of taste or smell or if anyone in your household is similarly unwell.

The art of breaking pieces down to make anything feel easy!

Do you have a piece you would love to learn in 2021? In this two-hour workshop, we will work on the art of breaking pieces down, however complex they might be, to make simple units/passages of music we find easy to practice.



Shelley's own composition of 'Come Hail or Higham Water' brought back memories of 'That Weekend' of storms, which closed Cumbria (around Desmond time). After a weekend of serious weather my husband rang me, just as I was about to set off for home, to tell me that Keswick, Ambleside etc....... were flooded out and completely shut.

Shelley's music summed it up perfectly. Raging wind, rain and hail. A thoroughly enjoyable romp. After we'd had a busy, fun morning learning the various parts of the piece she encouraged us to improvise a storm as an introduction. Whooshing, rattling of music sheets, fierce glissando, and anything we could think of to sound like a wild storm. I hope my clatter of paper knife on my teeth sounded like hail battering window panes, not rattling old bones. When all parts were put together it became quite impressive and really good fun.

A live performance at Kendal Parish Church ELIZABETH BASS (harp) and OLIVER ROBERTS (flute) Wednesday 4th November

Spanish Dance No. 5 'Andaluza', Granados. *Sonata in G 'Hamburger', CPE Bach*. Romance for Flute Op. 37, Saint Saens. *Naiades Fantasy Sonata for Flute and Harp*, Alwyn. Flute and Harp Sonata, Andy Scott.

What a joy to attend a live concert! Well worth sitting for an hour with a mask on. I was lucky enough to get a seat where I could actually see Elizabeth's hands and fingers working so fluently and confidently. The harp and flute do go together well. The programme was varied and lively. We were very lucky to experience this treat – the next day was lockdown 2! **Gill – editor**

The 4th of November in Kendal was a sparkling autumn Wednesday, when the last concert at the Parish Church before total lockdown (again) took place. Gill and Martin Salter-Smith and myself ventured out to attend what was a lovely hour or so of music from two brilliant professionals, and it was all very efficiently and safely managed. Gill and I sat very far apart but communicated by text and actually saw each other in person outside afterwards. It felt almost normal.

A contrasting programme started with Sonata in G by C.P.E. Bach, followed by Saint-Saens' Romance for Flute, a piece from Histoire du Tango (Astor Piazzolla), a Spiritual, and a contemporary flute and harp sonata (Andy Scott). They were all marvellously exciting pieces, filling the space with wonderful sounds. My eyes were glued to the harpist, Elizabeth Bass and her gifted hands: she made such varied use of her splendid gold and black pedal harp and her tone was exquisite. The flute complimented the harp as usual and the audience was left in no doubt that a performance is 99% perspiration and 1% inspiration. Ah, well, time for some practice.... Just a shame I didn't have a go on that magnificent harp! Thank you Elizabeth and Oliver, and for Gill for insisting I go — I'm so glad I made the time.

TRANSPENNINE HARPS (online) FESTIVAL - 7th - 8th NOVEMBER 2020 Tutors: Lucy Nolan and Tamsin Dearnley

I took part in a couple of workshops of Transpennine Harps (inaugural!) online Festival. **Lucy Nolan** gave us a taste of Mozart with a lovely arrangement of 'Eine Kleine Nachtmusik'. She was very clear and enthusiastic and presented the music in short-ish chunks to show the patterns and encourage those of us who panic when we don't have the 'dots' in front of us to consider learning from memory. One to work on for me....

Tamsin Dearnley was a rhythm BOSS! later that afternoon with some crafty tricks up her sleeve for us to tackle complex polyrhythms. First '3 against 4' beats which could be fitted to the pattern of silly sayings; 'for-ty seven Ro-nin' or 'pass the flipping bu-tter!'. Tamsin had also written a study to practise the polyrhythm, which is a really pretty piece in its own right. The next challenge was '4 against 5' - 'fif-ty cats sit-ting on the bed'. I had never come across this way to tackle polyrhythms before, but it definitely made it memorable.

Well done to **TP** for their inventive approach and organising the Festival - it must have been a lot of work but was great for us to be able to dip into their interesting timetable when meeting in person is not an option. **Ann Woolle**y



The first Transpennine Harp Festival took place online the first weekend of November. The two-day festival offered 12 bookable classes, two open classes and an online concert which were led by the group's tutors **Lucy Nolan** and **Tamsin Dearnley**. The diverse talents of Lucy and Tamsin resulted in a varied choice of classes such that choosing which to book was a real challenge. I would have liked to do them all! After much deliberating I decided to focus on the areas that challenge me most: technique, theory and rhythm. Over the two days I participated in a Finger Twisting Workshop focusing on technique and working on finger strengthening and finger isolation exercises; 'Music a la Mode' where Tamsin demystified the various modes in music; A Polyrhythm Workshop learning the 3 v 2 rhythm to a Paraguayan piece of music; A 'Memory Magic Workshop' learning lots of tips and tricks to help me memorise a piece of music; and finally a Harp Landscape Workshop which introduced me to a whole new world with Tamsin covering the basics on how to use free digital audio software.

The online concert was well attended and it was lovely to sit back and listen to Tamsin on her lever Harp and Lucy on her pedal harp; between them they played everything from Led Zeppelin to classical musical and percussion on the harp. The Open Harp Surgery and Show and Tell sessions were friendly and informative with lots of harpy chat. Technology seemed to work seamlessly throughout the weekend and classes were extremely interactive and relaxed. Over 100 harpists from across the UK participated in the weekend and I am sure that, like me, they are looking forward to the next one! **Wendy Ware**


