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## Wire Branch of the Clarsach Society Summer Medieval Music Course

The Wire Branch is offering an online summer workshop led by Bill Taylor in playing medieval music on all harps. The course will be broadcast over three days from **6th-8th August 2020**, and recordings will be available for participants to access and download.

The course will consist of six sessions altogether, with two 90-minute sessions each day, from 10:30 - 12 noon and from 14:00 to 15:30 UK time.

All harps are welcome, including those strung with gut/nylon as well as wire. Players at all levels are invited, except beginners. We will examine playing medieval music with a view to understanding how damping techniques can serve to clarify the melody, to enhance the accompaniment and to bring out decorations.

Bill has chosen pieces from a variety of repertoires, including

• Plainchant • Trouvère songs • English medieval dances • Cantigas de Santa Maria • Robert ap Huw manuscript Within this short course we'll develop skills for

• Fingering and damping • Playing decorations • Interpreting original notation • Improvising

We will meet online using Zoom. Participants will be sent invitation links by email for the six sessions, and it is simply a matter of clicking the links at the designated times. We recommend that participants download 'Zoom Client' (it's free) prior to the first session.

Music and articles will be emailed in advance for participants to print prior to the sessions. The price is **£100** for Wire Branch members and **£120** for non-members. 

HNW is one of three harp groups chosen especially for this project. Harps across the North is a new 15 minute multi-level harp ensemble piece composed by Lauren Scott for mixed-ability harp groups. Based on the 'Rain Stone' poem by Simon Armitage (Poet Laureate), Freshwater Tears, the piece is written in four parts. This piece is inspired by the joy of rain which is so beautifully demonstrated in the poem. This was the first online session we have tried. Being unable to meet 'live', Zoom served as a useful platform for the workshop. More than 30 members took part and judging by the many positive comments and write-ups we have received this new venture has been a great success. 


### Your comments

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During the warm sunny summer months, always make sure that your hire harp is not sat in direct sunlight. Sunlight can cause the harp wood to discolour in the long term which would be a shame. If you have an old sheet or sleeping bag you could place this over the harp when not in use to prevent sunlight UV rays on the harp.

Do keep on top of tuning your harp. You may be taking your harp out regularly for harp lessons which means different temperature environments, so be aware that this can affect the tuning of your harp. This is why we say to arrive early at HNW events to allow the harps to acclimatise in the room and allow for tuning up if necessary.
