A message from our convenor, Carol Coldwell



The 2021 Harps North West JaNEWary Challenge

We are getting excited for this coming year's JaNEWary Challenge! Look out for the emailed links to the teaching videos from **Mary Dunsford**, starting from 1st January and throughout the month.

Free to members and all other harpists.

A message from Mary

This year the JaNEWary Challenge features a lap-harp piece by **Kristine Warmhold** - a German composer who is prolific in her writing for lap-harps. It can of course be played on a larger harp too!

We also have two brand new compositions, which we shall be premiering in our learning! The first is by **Eira Lynn Jones**, professor of harp at the Royal Northern College of Music. This piece will feature in a new publication being released later in the month. As yet, this piece is

without a name and we are being invited to put forward our suggestions for this as we hear the piece on Day 1, and work on it over the subsequent days. Who knows, yours may be the chosen title for the final publication? Wow!

The third piece, again a brand new composition, is by the stunning film and tv composer, **Paul Lewis**. Paul is married to a harpist and has a great understanding of the instrument, as well as having decades of composing experience going back the 1960s. We are delighted to have him involved in this year's JaNEWary Challenge.

For those who are new to this, the JaNEWary Challenge is three pieces taught over the course of the month in short daily extracts. This encourages you to really focus in on the musicality and quality of what you play and accumulate the full piece over a period of days. This is done via a daily teaching video and a separate play along video to support and encourage, along with the sheet music released daily. Using our paper-saving function, if you can get to grips with how to load the paper into your printer to print in the orientation you want, then you can keep any notes you make as the piece grows over time, and we can do our part to support our environment. The sheet music also appears on screen. The piece is always played in full on the first day, so that you can hear what you will be aiming towards, but you are not then overwhelmed with tackling the full piece in one go. You can, of course, take it at your own pace and do it your own way.

We will share this via daily emails throughout JaNEWary. If you would prefer not to receive these, please do let us know. We look forward to sharing the month with you. **Mary**

How to enter

Your composition can be submitted as a recording (mp3 or equiv) and/or a score (pdf) along with the image that inspired you. If you'd like help with either the recording or the notation, please feel free to work together with others and combine skill sets.

We will also be running a basics of composition/trouble shooting workshop (see below) where you can ask questions and get ideas on how to record and notate your piece. A crib sheet on ideas of how to get started will follow.

Deadline for submissions – 31st March

We would love as many as possible of you to give it a go, even if you have never composed anything before or feel that you would not know where to start. What better way to learn more about the instrument?

Winning entries will be selected by a friendly, independent panel from outside HNW.

Free membership to HNW for 2021/22. Vouchers for music suppliers. An opportunity for their piece to be played at a future workshop/event.

The art of breaking pieces down to make anything feel easy!

Do you have a piece you would love to learn in 2021? In this two-hour workshop, we will work on the art of breaking pieces down, however complex they might be, to make simple units/passages of music we find easy to practice

This allows us to tackle anything, safe in the knowledge that SLOW means FAST and we will get there if we make sure we work using manageable steps to take us to our goal. Using techniques such as snippet practice, loop practice and creating our own exercises allows us to really master tricky sections. Please bring a piece along to the session you would like to learn in 2021, so that the ideas we cover can be tried out on your own piece towards the end of the session.

IMPORTANT NOTICE – not too many of those just now!

HNW members attending 'live' events where legally acceptable, please adhere to the following HNW protocols based on government guidance and law.

Be aware that national government and <u>local</u> guidelines can change with little notice!

HNW PROTOCOLS FOR ATTENDING LIVE EVENTS IN COVID-SECURE SETTINGS

- 1. Please do not attend a live session if you are feeling unwell, have a temperature, a persistent cough or have recently lost your sense of taste or smell or if anyone in your household is similarly unwell.
- 2. Undertake your own risk assessment and only attend if you are happy to accept the risks. Take particular account of your personal health and situation and those of others in your household or of those who visit you often.
- 3. Where possible, avoid car sharing with those not in your household.
- 4. Maintain at least 2m social distancing at all times.
- 5. Wear a face mask/covering at all times.
- 6. Bring and use hand sanitiser and antiseptic cleaning wipes.
- 7. Bring your own refreshments and utensils and do not share. Kitchens will not be available.
- 8. Print your own copies of the music to be played in advance.
