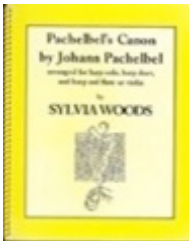

Ailie Robertson's view on scales!

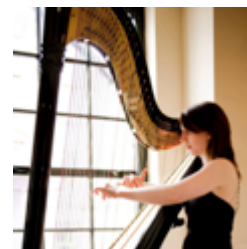
'Scales have a reputation for being among the least interesting activities we harpists face, but there is no reason scale practice should be dry and boring. In reality, scales are quite literally the basis of all our harp learning. They develop your:

- * Fingering and dexterity
- * Natural sense of tempo
- * Knowledge of keys and intervals
- * Level of discipline when it comes to practising.'

HARPS NORTH WEST NEWS - reports on recent events



The 2021 Harps North West JaNEWary Challenge

A summary of Mary's review of the participants' responses and feedback

This year's 2021 JaNEWary Challenge consisted of three pieces by three fabulous composers: Eira Lynn Jones, Paul Lewis and Kristine Warmhold. A warm 'thank you' to all those who took part.

The following bullet points are a synopsis of stats collated on this year's 2021 HNW JaNEWary Challenge. The stats were collated by Mary (Dunsford) using 47 responses to the Feedback Survey and with reference to YouTube, FaceBook and geographical spread. In addition, teaching methods, the pieces chosen and engagement with those pieces was considered:

- Facebook showed most interest from within the UK but our European, North and South American and Antipodean cousins also featured. A truly global arena!
- YouTube showed 5,969 views in 2021. Of these, 759 were 'unique' viewers. Therefore, more than 600 viewers were non-members.
- Most people used a mixture of both the Teaching and Play Along videos available for use in the challenge.
- Half of the respondents had looked at all three pieces during the month of January.
- 27 of 47 of the Feedback Survey respondents said they plan to look further at the pieces.
- On HNW's remit to broaden musical horizons, HNW scored a whopping 2.9 out of 3. Objective achieved we think!
- The JaNEWary challenge generally 'ramps up enthusiasm for playing harp and trying out new music'.

The quotes below represent a fraction of the personal feedback received that reflect the sentiment of the challenge:

'A 'thank you' for such a wonderful selection of pieces... I love them and will continue to practice & learn more.'

'Mary's instruction was superb as always. I love her calm encouraging approach!'

It's amazing that we're now so delighted with Zoom events, appreciating the flexibility they offer for us to 'be together' without travelling from both near and far. I loved all of the pieces we were introduced to and have added them to my ever growing 'keep practicing' box! Thanks to everyone who introduced us to their chosen piece and for sharing some wonderful background information and stories too. **Annie Allison**

What a lovely afternoon for playing harps when the other member of the household was watching the rugby. Well, after a day of hectic snowing it was a good surprise to find that some had melted away this morning. The chores were done, then the rain came. So it was a delight to listen and participate in the playing session for St. Valentine's Day with you lovely ladies and gentlemen of Harps North West.

We were welcomed by Carol and Gill. The session began with Gill taking us up to Hebridean Island of **Eriskay**, with the beautiful traditional Love Lilt arranged by **Anne Macdearmid**. Jane Freshwater filled us in saying that the song was sung by Margery Kennedy-Fraser, a Scottish soprano. It was recorded onto wax cylinders by a Father Allen!! Alice Pell told us that the song was in Songs of the Hebrides, a book with verses in as well as the music. (Felicity told us about a more advanced arrangement for the harp. It is found in the book, Sounding Strings, arrangements by Ronald Stevenson)

Carol then introduced **Perhaps Love**, composed by **John Denver**, arranged by **Susan Lambert**. Carol told us of a recording with Bryn Terfil singing it. (I didn't say that I live 25 miles from Bryn who is married to Hannah Stone who was at one time the Royal Harpist to the Prince of Wales). Mandy introduced the melody, **Moon River**, composed by **Henry Mancini** with lyrics by **Johnny Mercer**, where we could add our own accompaniment to Mandy's pleasant sounding arpeggios. That was followed by Judy leading the Robbie Burns piece - **My Love is Like a Red, Red Rose** arranged by **Sylvia Wood**. (Jane Freshwater had played the piece at a family wedding a few years ago). Ann introduced **Walking in the Rain**. Carol read out the verse, a piece written for Zac, the grandson of the composer, **Gill Lowden** who is a HNW member. We learned that this is in a book, **Outside of Time**, sold for the Multiple Sclerosis Society. We had a well-deserved break for tea and cakes.

Alice Pell introduced the tune, **Practical Magic**, composed by **Alan Silvestri**. Again we added our own accompaniment to the melody. We had a few funny minutes trying to listen to a YouTube rendition of the piece. Gill led us through **Cavatina**, composed by **Stanley Myers** and arranged by **Ann Macdearmid**. This had been played by Mandy at her son's wedding. Ann Woolley led us through **Dearly Beloved**, a piece

written by Shelley Fairplay during Lockdown. We had been introduced to this piece during a HNW workshop with Shelley a few weeks previously so we were all familiar with it. We thought it had a nostalgic medieval feel about it. Carol led **The End of the World!!** 'Why does the sun stop shining...', composed by **Arthur Kent**, lyricist **Sylvia Dean**, arranged by **Susan Lambert**. The last piece we attempted was **Rodgers and Hammerstein's You'll Never Walk Alone**, arranged by **Susan Lambert**, which has been immortalized by Captain Sir Tom Moore a few months before his passing a few weeks ago. He sang it with Michael Ball (whose grandmother lived in Mountain Ash, just two miles south of my house). **Marie Carson**

Thank you to all composers and arrangers. Sylvia Woods and Anne Macdearmid both willingly gave permission for us to use their pieces. Please consider purchasing their sheet music.

Rachel Newton Workshop

Sunday 21st February 10:00-12:00

I meant to say a big thank you HNW for organising such a great workshop last Sunday. Rachel is such a fantastic teacher - I really like the way she repeats things and still makes it all so interesting! I remember the Cromarty course she taught on and so much of what she did was without sheet music. It was so different, and initially daunting, but it really made me look at shapes and patterns much more carefully. Her hints for easy accompaniments are great. I've enjoyed practising the piece with its many possible left hand options. I hope she will be back again at some point to do another workshop? **Cathryn Binns**

On a rather sunny Sunday morning, with the birds twittering in the garden above the snowdrops, signed-up members of Harps North West Zoomed into another absorbing workshop. Rachel Newton had prepared for us her own composition entitled 'Hint of Spring' (slow waltz) and we worked on this piece for the two hours of the meeting. We had a ten minute break, when Gill divided us into chat rooms, which proved popular (so I'm told, I'm afraid I took the opportunity for a break at this point).

We were given three levels of difficulty, thereby catering for all abilities/the desire or not to stretch ourselves. In the first part Rachel took us through the right hand, emphasising technique and fingering, but especially technique: good to remind ourselves of this! Soon we had the essence of the tune.

In the second half we looked at the left hand and Rachel explained how we could add as little as one note, a chord, or an arpeggio as long as it was in harmony. Adding just one note per bar (left hand), she felt, actually added a certain wistfulness to the melody. She introduced us to the idea of including grace notes, turns and 'cuts' – distinctly Scottish- and she proceeded to play us examples within the piece. These are features which can be used with other music but sound particularly well on the harp.

All too soon time was up. We finished with a play through and were left with the piece of music to work on. Sadly I mentioned this to my teacher who then declared that she would like to hear it at my next lesson. So, no rest for the wicked!

I imagine we all learned something and our very grateful thanks to Rachel for her clear and comprehensive workshop and providing us with a charming and enjoyable piece with which to improve our skills and have fun meanwhile. Thanks also to those involved in the organisation, especially Zoom and access and recording: another HNW success. **Mandy Bartlett**

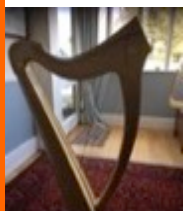
