The main festival venue will be in the Charlotte Mason building and all meals, except the Festival dinner, will be served in The Barn. The Saturday evening Festival dinner will be held in the Beehive building. Workshops will be held mainly in three adjacent soundproofed rooms, which will be opened up into one large space for the Saturday evening Party. There is a lift in the Charlotte Mason building for ease of moving harps around the venue. Parking is available outside the Charlotte Mason building for those with mobility issues.

Meet our Tutors



Jean Altshuler has been playing the harp since she was seven. She attended Music and Art High School in New York and graduated from Oberlin Conservatory on a harp scholarship. After many years as principal harpist with several American orchestras she moved to the Lake District where she now lives. She is a founding member of Harps North West and has taught workshops on early music and Eastern European tunes arranged for lever harp. She met classical guitarist Ed Heslam in January 2016 after seeing an anthology of his music beside the unique and extraordinary musical stones at the Keswick museum of local history. Since then she has enjoyed learning and playing Ed's arrangements of tunes from Cumberland and Westmorland. They have performed at venues throughout the North of England and Scotland



Mary Dunsford. You may know Mary best from our JaNEWary Challenge videos, where she gently guides you and players across the globe through new music in daily manageable segments, or from the Pachelbel's Canon online ensemble video we created, which was the largest collection of harps in one video to date! One of our regular tutors, Mary has been playing harp for well over 30 years and teaching for more than 20. Her versatility of style, coupled with her attention to detail, always makes for fun and informative sessions, where participants leave with renewed confidence and improved sound. A trained Musician in Healthcare, Mary works in both hospital and hospice settings with her music, and this sensitivity to meeting individuals in the moment transfers into her supportive teaching style.

Meet our Tutors



Lauren Scott is a UK harpist and composer and has worked as guest principal harp with many of the UK's leading orchestras and chamber groups. Lauren has been our Composer in Residence throughout 2021. She is also founder of a non-profit organisation that combines professional musicians with local young musicians to benefit local causes. As well as being involved in promoting youth music in her local area, Lauren is active in the wider UK harp community and has been chairman of the United Kingdom Harp Association; an organisation that puts on harp events and supports harpists across the UK. Charlotte Petersen. Based in her home town of Peebles in the Scottish Borders, Charlotte is one of Scotland's most talented harpists, composers, arrangers and performers of music for the clarsach and harp. A well-known face at the Edinburgh Harp Festival, Charlotte's warm stage presence and skilful communication make her a sought after performer. Audiences around the world have delighted at her compositions, some of which have been recorded as soundtracks for BBC radio plays. Charlotte's own arrangements have been published in a series of books and a number of these are included in the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland's Traditional Music Syllabus. An experienced and committed teacher, Charlotte teaches at schools around Edinburgh including St Mary's Music School and has inspired a succession of students to pursue a career in music

Alice Pell will be holding a session on Clarsach harps for ABSOLUTE BEGINNERS. No previous music experience is needed and harps will be provided. Hello there! My name is Alice and I started learning on a 34-string harp when I was eleven years old. I progressed onto a Concert harp and studied at Leeds College of Music. In more recent years I now prefer to teach and play on the Clarsach harp as well as the smaller 22-string lap harp shown in the photo. I feel lucky to have had this beautiful instrument accompany me along life's journey and I wouldn't have been without it.



Mary Dunsford will be leading the afternoon session for a **YOUTH GROUP**, which will include an hour of tuition from each of our guest tutors, Lauren Scott and Charlotte Petersen. Open to both lever and pedal harp players, Mary's sessions will focus on patterns and flow, and will have fun playing with the rhythm base to transform styles. We will also use the Pachelbel Canon pattern as a basis for exploration!

Lauren Scott: Let's get into Bad Habits! Fun session where we'll be learning riffs & harp loops based on Ed Sheeran's hit, Bad Habits. No reading necessary.

Charlotte Petersen: Charlotte's own arrangements of contemporary songs - you may have heard it on a film - A Million Dreams from The Greatest Showman or Sleepsong from Lord of the Rings or perhaps on a computer game as the theme tune. See how amazing these can sound when written for the harp.



Workshop Content

Jean Altshuler – Cumbrian Music, New and Old

Cumbrian tunes old and new composed and arranged by Ed Heslam especially for Harps North West. Ensemble pieces that sharpen your rhythmic skills and improve precision while expanding your repertoire.

Mary Dunsford - Fluid Movement

This year Mary is focusing in on fluidity of movement, with music to stretch but also free you. Tapping into your body's innate ability to both remember movement (muscle memory) and to move with more freedom than our concentrating-self may allow, this workshop will open up your playing beyond the gorgeous piece(s) you may learn within it!

Lauren Scott – Ensemble Workshops

Ensemble Workshop 1

Beatles Mayhem! Come and join us as we work through a fun medley of Beatles tunes for harp ensemble for mixed abilities. Lauren Scott 'work-shopped' this medley with Harps North West online during lockdown; so this is an opportunity to play it all together in person. Online resources are available to look at this music in advance of the day if you wish.

Ensemble Workshop 2

Harp Adventures. A chance to play together mixed ability ensemble music that has been written or arranged by our composer in residence, Lauren Scott.

Charlotte Petersen – Gaelic and Scottish Tunes

Exploring and learning a selection of accessible arrangements of Gaelic and Scottish tunes set at appropriate levels to add to your repertoire using different techniques to inspire and challenge.

For your guidance: playing levels

Mixed: All confidence levels catered for within the workshop.

Elementary/intermediate: You have been playing for a while and/or prefer to work at a steady pace. **Intermediate/advanced:** You are a more experienced player with a confident approach who prefers music that is slightly more challenging.



Alternative activities - Saturday pm

Alexander Technique with Erica Donnison



To help you find ease and lightness at your harp

This session by Erica Donnison, MSTAT, will help you find ease and poise when practicing and performing. Erica is a trained Alexander Technique teacher based in South Cumbria who has an interest in helping people perform to the best of their ability. The session will be experiential and involve some hands-on to help participants become more aware of the tension patterns that they hold. We will explore how to sit with ease whilst engaging your back to support your arms so that your hands can be free to play.

Tai Chi with Sarah McCormack



Sarah has been teaching Lee style Tai Chi for 18 years. The practice of Tai Chi whether it be for a short session or as part of a daily or weekly routine teaches us to relax. It can also increase energy, improve posture and balance, circulation and immunity, and flexibility. After a gentle warm up with a few stretches, Sarah will teach three or four breathing exercises and then a sequence of moves from the Lee Style Tai Chi Short Form, a moving meditation. The session will be of interest to complete beginners as well as anyone with any experience of Tai Chi.



Alternative activities - Saturday pm

Looking after your Harp session with Mark Sharp of Teifi Harps



This will be an informative and interactive talk on how to look after your harp between services; with an emphasis on string replacement and looking after your levers. There will be opportunities to 'have a go' as a lot of these skills are much easier to grasp when you have had the chance to physically do them under expert guidance.



Festival Party & Late Night Session

Hosted by Susan Lambert



Susan's introduction to the musical world was through her Gran. After studying music at Durham University she was lured into the world of the harp in 2012 through Harps North West, which saw her thrust upon Hadrian's wall on national television for BBC Wall of Sound Project with no more than 2 songs (on repeat) in her repertoire. Since then she has become obsessed and works as a full time musician, teaching piano, performing sax in a big band and then anything and everything harp related including attending workshops, performing for weddings and events, going into care homes and schools, folk sessions, remote recording, dipping her toe into the world of arranging and really just looking for any opportunity to play.

Welcome to the Saturday night festival party!

Hosted by Susan, the evening event will be a very relaxed gathering of all the festival attendees in which, aided by the festival tutors, everyone has the opportunity to perform to each other. 
