NEWS of Recent HNW Events

Higham Hall - A Weekend with the Harp with tutors Rachel Newton and Shelley Fairplay, 11th to 13th November


Fifteen keen harpists had a fabulous weekend at Higham Hall with Rachel Newton and Shelley Fairplay; even the sun shone. Rachel and Shelley have very different but complementary styles and there was a lovely relaxed, convivial feeling to the course.



In Rachel's classes we were introduced to two of her compositions, which were inspired by tales from a Scottish archive. 'Eggshell Brewery' was a story of how to tell if your baby was a fairy Changeling. If the test that Changelings 'eat a lot and cry a lot' did not distinguish them from normal babies you should distill water elaborately from one eggshell to another. Apparently a Changeling would be so amazed by the process that they would turn immediately into a little old man with a wispy beard and disappear up the chimney! The tunes created a soulful atmosphere and were taught by ear with plenty of encouragement for improvisation (we did also have the dots on a page for those of us who are wedded to reading the music...)

Shelley introduced us to some tuneful sounding warm ups including extracts of the tricky bits from the pieces we were tackling. 'At Kincombe' was inspired by a happy family day out, 'Still Share the Sun' by a mash-up of several pop songs including 'Let it Be' by Paul McCartney. All introduced with energy and

brio. The piece written when the course needed to be cancelled in a previous year, 'Come Hale or Higham Water', was played rousingly by the whole group with accompaniment from Shelley on her golden electric harp and looper.





Fifteen of us & two tutors gathered at Higham Hall on a miserable Friday evening in November. Once safely inside all misery disappeared as we were treated to an inspirational, fun, sociable and generally lovely weekend of harp playing. We self divided into two groups - Steady & Superstars (or something like that?!). The small groups meant we all had personal interaction and attention from the tutors and could progress at our own pace.

We had a break on a beautiful Saturday afternoon during which nearly everyone got out to enjoy our stunning surroundings in glorious autumn sunshine with walks, relaxation & at least one person even had a swim in the lake.

The Saturday evening 'session' when everyone was invited to 'perform', but with no pressure, added to the fun; as did the Sunday lunchtime get together, when each group could hear what the others had been up to, tucked away in their different rooms.

When you add in lots of tasty and plentiful food, non-stop chat and opportunities to make new friends and renew old friendships, it all results in a totally memorable & enjoyable couple of days.

I had a real treat on Saturday, in the audience for the Christmas party in Leasgill. Considering that the venue was changed at the last minute due to heating problems, the organisers did exceptionally well - the venue was cheery, warm(!), and very Christmasy. Harpists came from far and wide, one from Edinburgh, and even further viewed on zoom.

It was fabulous to see so many harps, 23 in all, after a valiant and welcome zoom version in 2020 and last year's restricted and cautious numbers in Braithwaite - both very enjoyable events.




The group pieces included 'In The Snow Where the Deers Are' by Wendy Stewart, 'Down by the Walnut Tree' by Shelley Fairplay, and 'Pachelbel's Kite' by Gill Lowden. There were two Christmas tunes, the arrangement of 'I saw Three Ships' by Susan Lambert and the Ukrainian carol 'Carol of the Bells', (which was definitely better the second time at the faster speed - well done all those flying fingers!). My favourite however, was 'Pachelbel's Kite', a very witty and lively interpretation of the famous canon - now embedded in my brain after all the practices for the video and live event lead by Mary during the epidemic. Thank you Gill!

Red Rose Harps performed 'Kling Glöckchen' a 19th Century german tune, a mixed group played 'The Grenadier and the Lady' a very sweet tune. Very bravely Gill Salter-Smith played 'The Water is Wide' - well done, it sounded lovely. Harps South Lakes played 'Goose Creek' and the very 'Cumbria Deliciosa'.

Clara did a brilliant performance of a welsh tune on her very sparkly pedal harp, 'The Minstrel's Adieu to his Native Land' with dozens of spectacular harmonics stunning. Mary explained how this was suggestive of the original welsh triple harp used by the composer John Thomas.

The prize for best decorated harp was won by Marion Beagan - the photo shows how she worked out how to wind ribbon on the front of the harp without it slipping by hooking it on to the tuning pins - simple and decoratively effective. The prize was presented to Marian by Ian Ludlaw and Lesley a former convenor, also congratulated the group on the progress in the last 20 years.


