News from members

Edinburgh International Harp Festival - Opening concert



A feast of gorgeous harp music was in store when we attended the big opening night concert of the 2023 Edinburgh International Harp Festival or EIHF to the regulars! It was in the surroundings of the George Watson college in Edinburgh for the second time, a little further down the road from the previous venue of many years at Merchiston School . The beautiful big hall had some ground level seating as well as tiered seating in the hall used for concerts which made good viewing for all.

Isobel Mieras officially opened the harp festival with a well spoken introduction and welcomed Scottish Harpist Ailie Robertson who was performing in the first half. Ailie looked lovely in a beautiful blue velvet trouser outfit. Ailie actually attended the school where the festival now resides. She started her harp lessons at 10yrs old with tuition from Festival founder - Isobel Mieras, who told us that her first piece that she taught Ailie was 'Singing Strings'.

Ailie took us on a journey with some Scottish music - 'waiting a thousand days and nights' - a nod to the Scottish whisky making process and her own arrangement of a Latin American flamenco dance after being inspired by her trip to South America and Buenos Aires 6 months before lockdown.

She used techniques such as playing with the back of her nails on the harp which was impressive. She played 'pres-de-la-table' to create the Spanish guitar effect too.

She even performed her old favourite "Singing Strings" that she learnt with her teacher Isobel Mieras.

Final piece - 'Haar' - atmospheric piece describing the mist over the sea. She used clever pedal looping effects during this piece which made a beautiful musical atmosphere.

She also played a lullaby which was her motherly touch in respect of her new baby daughter born at the end of last year. Her performance was well received by the audience and thoroughly enjoyed.

In the second half we were introduced to the American Harpist Kim Robertson. She is no stranger to the EIHF and last attended the concert 12yrs ago. I enjoyed her easy going nature as she connected with the audience between her pieces.

She performed 'Shenandoah' - as a solo piece and some American folk pieces too.

She played a duet - with her long term dueting friend Sunita Staneslow who now lives in the Shetlands but had previously lived in America and knew Kim then.

She performed a beautiful arrangement of 'Jupiter - I vow to thee my country' as a duet with Sunita again. I really want to get my hands on that piece for the harp!

They both played on Camac harps that had been kindly loaned to them both for the concert. One red harp and one green harp, both harps had been modified for amplification for the concert. Played with back of nails and did some string bending too!

All in all, a fabulous concert and it was so nice to return to the festival after not being able to attend it in person for the last three years. Interestingly following the Covid Pandemic, the festival was still offering zoom workshops to a limited number of pupils per session. So even if you were unable to attend the festival in person you are still able to get involved online.

It was lovely to see harp friends whom I had met up with before in previous festivals and bump into HNW member Susan Lambert too who had also made the trek to Edinburgh, so along with my family we all sat together to enjoy the gorgeous harp concert.

Harps and Crowns

It was great to see a harpist featuring at the coronation of King Charles as the guests took their places. The King, when Prince of Wales, reinstated the role of Royal Harpist in 2000, and there have been six people in the role since, with Alis Huws the current harpist. They get to play a truly unique £150,000 harp, made especially for the Royal Harpist by the Italian company Salvi - who describe it as 'an urepeatable instrument'. It is covered in gold leaf and decorated with welsh symbols. You can see the harp here https://www.salviharps-special-editions/prince-of-wales-harp/.
