All being well, HNW is planning on holding more 'live' events over the coming months.

COVID 19 PROTOCOLS FOR ATTENDING LIVE EVENT IN COVID-SECURE SETTINGS

- 1. Please do not attend a live session if you are feeling unwell, have a temperature, headache or have recently lost your sense of taste or smell. Or if anyone in your household is similarly unwell.
- 2. Undertake your own risk assessment and only attend if you are happy to accept the risks. Take particular account of your personal health and situation and those of others in your household or of those who visit you often.
- 3. Where possible, avoid car sharing with those not in your household. Follow government guidance where car sharing is necessary.
- 4. Maintain at least 2m social distancing at all times.
- 5. Wear a face mask/covering at all times.
- 6. Bring hand sanitiser and antiseptic cleaning wipes.
- 7. Bring your own refreshments and utensils and do not share. Kitchens will not be available.
- 8. Print your own copies of the music to be played in advance.
- 9. Avoid touching other people's property. Wash your hands often.
- 10. Be familiar with the risk assessment and the specific requirements for each venue you visit. E.g. One way systems, use of toilets.
- 11. Respect the decisions of others but do not be afraid to ask others to adhere to the protocols if you feel you are at risk.

We understand and respect that there will be some members who prefer not to attend live events. With this in mind we are working on ways to ensure that all members can be included through the use of online **Zoom** contact.

Ruth Wall Concert – 7 PM FRIDAY 4^{TH} SEPTEMBER

This summer Ruth was due to perform live in beautiful Glasbury near Hay-on-Wye. Sadly the concert has had to be postponed. But the good news is that in the interim we are putting on a short online concert. The concert will be recorded at Ruth's home in Cornwall, featuring composer Graham Fitkin, and she will play three gloriously different harps – the Wire harp, Bray harp and more familiar Concert harp.

The programme includes music by Satie, Piazzolla, Cage and Machaut. There will be a Graham Fitkin world premiere and a little Steve Reich.

We all work with assumptions and within frameworks of unspoken rules, life trotting on happily until these 'norms' are challenged in small or big ways. Each of these composers has contravened the norms of their time and cultural expectations in their music. Music develops throughout history via these sorts of interventions, so come and have a listen.

This concert has been organised by Hay Music in collaboration with Glasbury Arts Harp Summer School. Hay Music Trust started life in 2011 with the aim of bringing high quality chamber music to Hay-on-Wye. You can find out more about the work they do at haymusic.org. 
RACHAEL GLADWIN – Full Day Workshop SUNDAY 11th OCTOBER Venue: Burton in Kendal Memorial Hall

Rachel's description of her workshop

'I'd like to focus on rhythm: starting with body percussion, rhythm games and then using harps, exploring some Cuban and African grooves. Creating tunes together from the bass line up, writing rhythmic chord sequences and adding improvisation over the top. Depending on how confident your group is with improvisation we can either start with the basics or try something a little more complicated. I'd like to break into smaller groups to create new mini-pieces together using the ideas we've learned about. And finish up with learning a simple jazz tune, throwing in all of our best improvisation ideas and harp percussion.'







The choice for September comes from Catherine, Gill, Linda and Susan who all met Ruth Flavin on the harp building course in Moniaive, Dumfries & Galloway.
